

MINUTES OF SECTION 106 PUBLIC MEETING

U.S 31E RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

March 5, 2002

The meeting began just after 6:00 with an introduction by Tom Jobe. Paul Estes gave a summary of what has happened on the project to date. Richard Sutherland and Jayne Fiegel gave an overview of the Section 106 process and how interested persons could become Consulting Parties. Comprehensive booklets were handed out to all attendees which outlined what Consulting Parties are, how to become one, and what the Section 106 process is all about. Also included in the booklet was an example letter of application for potential Consulting Parties, an Area of Potential Effect Map with written description, and information on how to contact the project team.

Upon conclusion of an approximate 35 minute presentation, questions were taken from the floor for an additional 40 minutes. Consulting Parties were asked to have comments back to the project team by April 1, 2002.
